DEAR COMMUNITY MEMBERS,

This is an incredibly exciting time to be part of the Phoebe Family. We emerged from the COVID pandemic stronger than ever and are now in the midst of transformative projects that will enhance the quality and accessibility of our care and ensure Phoebe is well-prepared to meet the healthcare needs of the people of southwest Georgia for decades to come.

Phoebe has become a state and national leader in healthcare workforce development. A growing shortage of nurses and other healthcare providers is the greatest challenge facing health systems today, but we are not sitting back and waiting for others



to find solutions to that problem. Phoebe is taking bold and innovative actions to inspire young people and help our communities grow and prosper. We have expanded our education partnerships in numerous ways. We created the Phoebe Health Science Pathway that puts students at 4C Academy on the road to healthcare careers while they're still in high school. We partnered with Ignite College & Career Academy in Americus to support and offer work opportunities to their students on the healthcare track. We developed a virtual reality game as part of our outreach to middle school students to teach them about careers available in healthcare. And we are helping area colleges – including Albany State University, Georgia Southwestern State University and Albany Technical College – educate more healthcare students.

In the fall of this year, the Phoebe Living & Learning Community will open on our Albany campus as the new home of the expanded Albany Technical College nursing program. It will also include apartments for students so they can live where they learn and train. By collaborating with our many partners and helping them grow their healthcare programs, we are providing new education and career opportunities that will keep bright young southwest Georgians here at home – increasing the pipeline of healthcare professionals for Phoebe and other healthcare providers in our area.

Years of work by our trauma team paid off in March, when we officially earned designation as a Level 2 trauma center from the Georgia Department of Public Health. Our new Trauma & Critical Care Tower will be home to that modern and advanced trauma center and will also include a vastly expanded neonatal intensive care unit and a new adult intensive care unit. After the tower opens in late 2024, our current emergency center will be completely overhauled to create one large and seamless new ER.

We continue to expand our network of primary care, urgent care and specialty care clinics and send our mobile wellness clinics on the roads throughout southwest Georgia, taking healthcare directly to underserved communities.

At Phoebe Sumter, we've invested resources to expand cancer care and improve our ability to serve behavioral health patients. And we have vastly improved the emergency center at Phoebe Worth to ensure quick access to quality emergency care to folks in and around Sylvester.

Phoebe is more connected to the communities we serve than ever, and I have never been more proud to be part of an organization.

As part of our journey to become a high reliability organization, committed to achieving a goal of

zero patient harm, we completed Safety First and Superior Service training with our entire staff. And, we unveiled The Phoebe Way – our promise to make every life we touch better by putting Safety First, offering Superior Service and providing Exceptional Care to everyone, every day.

I believe Phoebe is more connected to the communities we serve than ever, and I have never been more proud to be part of an organization. Phoebe has been a vital institution in southwest Georgia for more than 110 years, and I can't wait to see what we accomplish together in the years to come.

TRAUMA & CRITICAL CARE



Phoebe is now the only Level 2 trauma center south of Columbus. We earned that designation from the state of Georgia in March of this year, and we are now pursuing national verification from the American College of Surgeons. This designation will allow us to treat more trauma patients and ensures we follow best practices in trauma care. By the end of this year, our Emergency & Trauma Center will move into our new Trauma & Critical Care Tower which will also house a new neonatal intensive care unit (NICU) and an adult intensive care unit (ICU). Once construction is complete, the current emergency center will be completely remodeled, resulting in one seamless, large and modern emergency and trauma center.

NEONATAL INTENSIVE CARE SERVICES




As part of Phoebe's designation as one of the state's six regional perinatal centers, our NICU team cares for premature babies from 22 Georgia counties. Often, because of the incredible need for neonatal services, our amazing NICU team is caring for more than 40 babies. This project will take us from 11,000 square feet of NICU space to 45,000 square feet and will include overnight accommodations for families.

ECONOMIC IMPACT

The new Trauma & Critical Care Tower is a testament not only to Phoebe's commitment to provide the region's most comprehensive healthcare services, but to continue to be southwest Georgia's most vital economic engine.



- Violence & injury prevention





SERVING OUR COMMUNITY

One of the major ways Phoebe gives back to the community is by providing free healthcare to many patients who cannot afford to pay medical bills. In fact, Phoebe is one of the top providers of charity care in the country. According to a recent report from Modern Healthcare magazine, Phoebe provided \$63,000,000 in charity care in 2022, representing 6.61% of our operating expenses. That percentage was the second highest nationally among small healthcare systems (those with less than \$1B in total revenue).

HEALTH FAIRS

Each year we host health fairs for men, women and children which provide health screenings, overall health education and cancer screening information. Additionally, Phoebe hosts a mentoring event for young boys in conjunction with the men's health fair called **Ties That Bind**. The event brings dozens of male community members together with young boys to not only teach them how to tie a tie but inspire them to be the best they can be.

HABITAT FOR HUMANITY

Phoebe is teaming with Habitat for Humanity to help revitalize the neighborhood around our main campus in central Albany. We donated five properties near the hospital to Habitat and pledged to fund the construction of one of the homes. In October 2023, our organizations celebrated the groundbreaking of the first Habitat home adjacent to Phoebe. We know Habitat homeowners will be great neighbors, and we look forward to more of them moving in over the next several years.

NURSE-FAMILY PARTNERSHIP



Phoebe's Nurse-Family Partnership teaches first-time moms how to have a successful pregnancy and develop parenting skills to create better futures for themselves and their babies. Through this program, specially-educated nurses make regular visits to moms-to-be, starting early in the pregnancy and continuing through the child's second birthday. Nurses provide support, education and counseling on preventive health practices, including thorough

prenatal care from their healthcare providers, improving diets and reducing any use of habit-forming substances. The program also supports a healthy postpartum experience for mother and baby and supports healthy cognitive, physical and emotional growth and development for the child.



\$233,333 invested by Phoebe in the Nurse-Family Partnership, and **60** first-time mothers were part of the program in 2023.



ELEVATION PROJECT

Phoebe partnered with Morehouse School of Medicine and Albany-area churches for the Elevation Project. The partnership focuses on prostate cancer awareness. Together, the organizations hold community events to offer information and free prostate screenings. Since its inception, we have had:



9 community health fairs with Elevation Project, 477 men tested9% had abnormal PSAs, and 3 prostate cancers were found

FLINT RIVER FRESH

Phoebe's partnership with Flint River Fresh continues to grow. In addition to partnering on community gardens, the organizations launched a pilot program called **Fresh Rx**, a study with diabetic patients. Through this prescription-for-produce program, uninsured patients of Phoebe Primary Care of Albany received fresh produce every other week for six months. Patients were monitored with a goal of helping them better control their A1C levels through healthier eating.

MOBILE WELLNESS CLINICS





Phoebe's Mobile Wellness Clinics take healthcare directly to our underserved communities. Fifty percent of southwest Georgians have serious health issues. Our mobile clinics help improve access to primary care, specialty care and chronic care management for people who may have difficulty traveling to a doctor's office. With the help of our two Phoebe Wellness Clinics, we are working to remove barriers to care and making real improvements to the health and wellness of our communities.

Representative Sanford Bishop helped secure \$1 million in funding for two additional Mobile Wellness Clinics. The two additional units, which will hit the road this year, will improve access to healthcare and health education in rural areas and underserved communities throughout southwest Georgia.

Each April during National Volunteer Week, we recognize our incredible volunteers for their hard work and dedication. In 2023, we held an open house and a special reception to show our continued appreciation for their invaluable assistance throughout our hospital.







PET THERAPY

Phoebe's Pet Therapy group has 12 volunteers and 13 volunteer dogs. Each month they visit with patients and employees. Pet therapy offers many benefits: lowers blood pressure, releases endorphins to produce a calming effect, decreases anxiety and depression, and provides comfort. In 2023, they gave 262 volunteer hours.



RAMP BUILDERS

For nearly 20 years, Phoebe has partnered with the Sowega Council on Aging to provide this invaluable community outreach program. Since 2011, Phoebe Volunteer Services has donated \$360,000 to the Retired Senior Volunteer Program ramp builders, building approximately 1,600 ramps.

EDUCATION

LIVING & LEARNING



In January 2023, Phoebe broke ground on the Living & Learning Community, an innovative partnership with Albany Technical College (ATC). A \$50 million investment, the Living & Learning Community will address the critical nursing shortage by creating an expanded nursing school for ATC, along with 80 apartments so nursing students can live on the same campus where they will learn and train. The Living & Learning Community will welcome its first students July of this year.

In addition, Phoebe proudly partners with medical and pharmacy colleges as an on-site training facility, giving students the opportunity to gain direct patient care experience.

Phoebe invested **\$2.7** million to address the long-standing nursing shortage by partnering with institutions of higher learning to support nursing infrastructure, helping to create **1K+** new nursing slots.

Residents spend three years in Albany treating patients and honing their skills under the guidance of an outstanding team of faculty members, and our goal is that most of them stay in southwest Georgia to practice medicine after they graduate.



PHOEBE FOUNDATION

Established in 1989, the **Phoebe Foundation** is an essential part of our health system, supporting initiatives as well as helping both patients and Phoebe employees. With the support of our generous donors, the Foundation is able to make a real difference in the lives of those we serve, providing lifesaving technology and services in southwest Georgia.

CHILDREN'S MIRACLE NETWORK HOSPITALS



As one of the five Children's Miracle Network Hospitals (CMN) in the state, Phoebe is fortunate to receive lifesaving equipment, programs and education from this incredible nonprofit organization. Every dollar raised for CMN in our service area helps infants and children in our community.

Phoebe's Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU) is an invaluable part of our health system. As a regional perinatal center, we serve infants from 22 counties. Our

team is often on the road, answering urgent calls to bring babies in crisis to our NICU. Through funding provided by CMN, we were able to purchase a new NICU ambulance to provide the safest and most high-tech transport option to ensure babies get the care they need as quickly as possible.

SUPPORTING OUR PATIENTS



In 1987, Phoebe established the Light House as a comforting place for cancer patients and their loved ones. Sadly, a storm destroyed the building in 2017, taking away our patients' peaceful refuge. In 2020, Phoebe opened the newly constructed Light House in the 500 block of West 2nd Avenue. A \$2.6 million investment, this new Light House was made possible through donations to the Phoebe Foundation. Since opening, the Light House has had more than 2,000 overnight patient stays.



Phoebe Hospice at Willson Hospice House offers compassionate services in a peaceful and unique setting. The Willson Hospice House opened in 2010 and serves an average of 1,500 patients per year. It was made possible through generous donors and continues to be supported through contributions to the Foundation. Willson Hospice House provides inpatient hospice care and respite care in a comfortable place for patients and their families.

SUMTER FOUNDATION

Phoebe Sumter Foundation helps touch the lives of thousands of individuals throughout Sumter and neighboring counties. The Foundation focuses on four key areas – charity, medicine, education and science – playing an integral role in supporting many of Phoebe Sumter Medical Center's initiatives. Between philanthropic events and generous donations from employees and community members, the Phoebe Sumter Foundation is able to provide support to patients and Phoebe employees, technology enhancements and much more.

HELPING TO MEET THE NEEDS OF PATIENTS



The Phoebe Sumter Foundation reached its \$250,000 goal for the oncology clinic expansion project at Phoebe Sumter Medical Center. Additionally, the renovation will help accommodate the needs of patients and increase access to care.

In 2023, the Foundation worked with the hospital to create a behavioral health unit adjacent to the emergency room, ensuring patients and family members have a safe space for those with behavioral health needs.

The Foundation also purchased all the necessary e-ICU equipment needed for the partnership with Hicuity Health, which will enhance our intensive care. This telehealth collaboration with our onsite bedside ICU teams will ensure our patients continuously receive the highest quality expert critical care 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

RAISING MONEY FOR CANCER PATIENTS



Two special events are held each year to raise money for local cancer patients. Sumter Pink, held in October, invites participants to walk in honor or memory of a loved one. In 2023, more than 250 walkers participated.

Lights of Love is a beloved annual tradition that kicks off the holiday season. Thousands of lights are lit on the tree in honor of local cancer patients and their families. Together, Sumter Pink and Lights of Love raised a total of \$51,295 in 2023.

BARIATRICS

Phoebe Bariatrics is a nationally accredited, comprehensive program with a goal of long-term success for our patients. Since the program began in 2014, the bariatric team has completed more than 720 bariatric surgeries. In 2023, Phoebe Sumter Medical Center was included as one of only 101 hospitals in the United States on Money.com's first-ever Best Hospitals for Bariatric Surgery list.





CANCER CARE

The Phoebe Cancer Center is accredited by the Commission on Cancer and offers patients the chance to stay close to home while receiving the most advanced cancer treatments – from radiation and chemotherapy to stem cell apheresis and clinical trials. In 2022, the Phoebe Oncology Wellness Center opened, creating a dedicated place for Phoebe cancer patients to heal, recover and enjoy survivorship while focusing on the wellbeing of their mind, body and spirit.



The Oncology Clinic at Phoebe Sumter brings state-of-the-art technology and the highest quality service to those who live in and around Sumter County. Our main goal is to offer comprehensive oncology/hematology outpatient care from screenings and diagnosis to treatment. The clinic is undergoing an expansion project to help increase access to care.

GASTROENTEROLOGY


Our team of experienced gastroenterologists and advanced practitioners provides patients with timely diagnoses and treatment of digestive and liver disorders. In March 2023, the new specialized digestive room at Phoebe Putney Memorial Hospital opened. It features state-of-the-art equipment allowing advanced procedures to be done in the endoscopy suite rather than the operating room. HEART & VASCULAR

In 2023, Phoebe marked the 40th anniversary of the region's first open-heart surgery, which expanded the availability of advanced, lifesaving care in this part of the state and has led to continual growth and advancement of cardiovascular care. In 2022, Phoebe was the first in the region to complete complex valve-in-valve replacements, patent foramen ovale (PFO) and atrial septal defect (ASD) closures to repair holes in the heart without requiring open-heart surgery. Additionally in 2023, Phoebe physicians performed the first MitraClip transcatheter mitral valve repair (TMVR) and implanted a Cardiac Contractility Modulation (CCM) device to treat weak and failing heart muscles, making Phoebe the only hospital south of Eatonton, Georgia, and north of Tallahassee, Florida, to offer the device.





ORTHOPAEDICS & SPORTS MEDICINE

Phoebe Orthopaedics & Sports Medicine specializes in the diagnosis and treatment of many orthopaedic conditions. From congenital conditions to sports medicine injuries in teens and adults, our team of experts offers a full range of solutions for strength and mobility.

In January 2023, Phoebe Orthopaedics & Sports Medicine unveiled its 25,000 sq. ft. expansion project. The renovated clinic features a large physical therapy gym and new treatment, procedure and x-ray rooms. Plus, each physician has their own spacious pod and exam rooms. This modern and efficient space allows our team to serve more patients.

GENERAL SURGERY

Phoebe General Surgery is proud to have a highly experienced team of board-certified general surgeons serving Albany, Americus and surrounding communities. Our surgeons perform surgeries for a wide range of conditions affecting the body. In 2022, Phoebe Putney Memorial Hospital was the first hospital in southwest Georgia to offer the transoral incisionless fundoplication (TIF®) procedure using the innovative EsophyX® device. Shortly after, Phoebe Sumter began performing the same procedure. This innovative incisionless surgery treats patients who suffer from daily heartburn or other symptoms of reflux.



In 2023, Phoebe expanded its robotic surgery program by adding an additional da Vinci robot at Phoebe Putney Memorial Hospital and one at Phoebe Sumter Medical Center – the first robotic surgery system for the hospital in Americus. The da Vinci robotic surgical system provides many advantages to our patients, including quicker recovery times and shorter hospital stays.
